Students, please remember that your creative history project is due in next Tuesday 15 March.


SECONDARY SPORT

Secondary students will be completing their last session in the Basketball unit next Wednesday.



Year 7/8

We are studying Medieval Europe and in particular, Feudalism. Some topics that are being covered are:- The spread of Christianity, the power of the church, crusades, the peasants' revolt and Joan of Arc.

Year 9/10

Students are studying World War II. The road to war in Europe, and its causes. Then, there is a focus on Australia at war - Kokoda, Australian prisoners of war, the home front, women, the bombing of Darwin, and Christian responses to the war.



<u>Year 7/8</u>

Changing Nations - Urbanisation

Students are studying where Australians lived in the past, where they live now, urbanisation, understanding thematic maps, creating a reading pictographs, migration and movement, and urban church ministries.

Year 9/10

Geographies of Human Well-being. What makes a good life? Wealth and Poverty Students are looking at who are better and worse off, constructing an interpreting scattergraphs, interpreting a cartogram, improving well being and human rights, and a Christian response to wealth and poverty. The Year 9/10 are also fundraising for Operation Christmas Child.

Both groups will enter the Geography Competition at the end of term and are doing some practise tests.

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
