GRADE 4–6 SCIENCE

First, we each got four cups of food colouring, hot water and cold water, the food colouring colours were blue and yellow. Secondly, we put the hot water in one of the cups and the cold water in the other cup. Thirdly, we got droppers to drop the food dye into the cups. The food colouring in the hot water absorbed very quickly and easily and the blue food colouring in the hot water became black. The food colouring in the cold water didn't fully absorb and took a very long time to absorb, this is because molecules move quicker where it is hot/warm. Overall, it went well and was a wonderful fun experience.


Wonderful Wind Wagon

We had a science inquiry experiment about how to create a vehicle which moves by wind. We worked in partners to make the vehicle.

Next you place four small gears each at the end of two skewers for wheels. Then you get two pieces of paper, put sticky tape the ends of the paper to the skewers with the wheels, to make the wheels not fall off. Then you get another piece of paper to make the sail and decorate it. Next you attach the sail to the car and give it a test. Both cars didn't work at first, so we tried to fix it.

Annie and Winnie fixed it by putting a skewer underneath the wagon, so that the wagon would be a bit higher, and it wouldn't drag on the ground. Alex and Judith fixed theirs by putting a skewer on the other side of the sail, and put skewers underneath.

Then we did another test run to be sure that they work. Then we made our racetrack, which was across the table. Annie raced Alex and Annie won, then Winnie raced Judith and Judith won. Annie, Winnie, Judith and Alex
