We acknowledge that there are sometimes, regrettably, situations where children are removed from their families for their safety but it should never be justified purely by the colour of their skin.

We are one human race, equal under God and as precious as we are unique. I encourage you to take the opportunity to have some discussion around the dinner table and help your kids to formulate opinions and loving attitudes towards other people and cultures. They are tomorrow's leaders.
