From the Principals Desk



RETURN TO SCHOOL

As we head back to school, please note the following information:

- After careful consideration, it has been decided that there will be no excursions, assemblies, and other large gatherings in Term 2. We are adopting the protective measures outlined by the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students, teachers, staff and families.
- We ask parents and carers to pay particular attention to the requirement for adults to maintain physical distancing of 1.5 metres at all times if you need to be on school grounds. Parents and carers should not gather in areas around the school such as car parks, the school office area, at the school gates and outside classrooms during this time.
- Our school buses are continuing to operate, and will be running as usual with the return of all students. There is no requirement for students to wear masks but they will be provided on the buses and can be worn if requested by a parent. Sanitiser is provided on the bus and students will be encouraged to clean their hands when entering the bus.
- It is essential that you keep your child home from school if they are unwell. In accordance with Victorian Health Advice parents or carers of any child showing signs of illness will be asked to collect them immediately from the school. Signs of illness may include a cough, runny/stuffy nose, fever, sore throat, diarrhoea, and or vomiting.
- If any staff member or student returns a temperature at or above 38.2C they will not be allowed to be at school. We do have non-contact temperature check facility if required.
