From the Principal's Desk



Our new Scripture memory is Philippians 4:4-13. Yesterday in Assembly, Mr Nicholas was talking to the students about the need for us to "Rejoice in the Lord always." The Apostle Paul emphasises that this attitude of Joy should be constant, not temporary. This echoes the words of Philippians 3:1, to "rejoice in the Lord," a phrase Paul also uses in Philippians 4:10 regarding his own actions. Believers find their joy and hope in God. Joy is part of the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) and is important for every believer. Paul seems focused on the idea that rejoicing is to take place at all times. We often forget that Paul wrote these words while a prisoner

in Rome. He had been wrongfully arrested for some time, shipwrecked on the way there, bitten by a snake, and left under house arrest for two years (Acts 27:39-8:16). He had every reason to complain, yet focused on rejoicing. Both his teaching and example provide an amazing model. Every believer should seek to rejoice in the Lord despite difficult situations, just as Paul did. Easier said than done!
