

Our secondary students entered an Australian Taxation Office Video Competition as part of their Maths and English studies. Congratulations to our Year Nine students who have been shortlisted to the next stage for their entry into the Tax, Super and You Competition.

There are five shortlisted entries in each of the junior and senior categories and in each category the following prizes will be awarded:

1st prize – \$400 per entry plus \$600 for the school

2nd prize – \$250 per entry plus \$400 for the school

3rd prize – \$150 per entry plus \$300 for their school

People's Choice Award – \$400 plus \$600 for their school

As part of the next stage of the competition, the students are required to submit a recorded video 'pitch' for the panel of judges.
