SHOWING INITIATIVE

Recognizing and doing what needs to be done before I am asked to do it.

Initiative is such an important part of character development. It demonstrates that a person is self-disciplined, able to take responsibility and thinks outside the box.

Ask God for initiative and the

ability to be productive in whatever we are called to do. Paul writes in Ephesians 4:23 "Let the Spirit renew your thoughts and attitudes". God wants to stimulate our minds with wholesome thinking.

Linked with initiative is the work ethic of being perseverant. It is the energy and the desire to achieve. It is motivation, determination and commitment, faithfulness, patience and resilience in the face of difficulty and a willingness to work hard. Paul challenges his readers to persevere - "Here is my advice . . . you should finish what you started. Let the eagerness you showed in the beginning be matched now." 2 Corinthians 8: 10 - 11

While these two traits are being worked out, it is important to show respect, to always consider the rights and the needs of others. Treat them sensitively, kindly, courteously, and within the limits of law, conscience and Scripture.

Colossians 3:23 reminds us to do all of our tasks as if we are doing it for the Lord, not for people.

THE SOUND WAY

Grades 3-6 have begun to use The Sound Way as part of our Literacy Program.

The Sound Way programs teach and provide the students with a tangible understanding of the mechanics of the English language. Students actually learn the 'how and why' of the construction of most English words. For example, the five reasons there are for having a final silent 'e' in words; or the reason we double the 'p' in a word like "stopping" but not in a word like "jumping.

The Sound Way program begins by first teaching, loading and programming the brain with the 45 sounds (phonemes) that comprise English words and the 75 ways there are of representing these sounds on paper (phonograms).

By combining and integrating this knowledge with the rules of English spelling, we are then able to write and produce words from their sounds.
