Students are to meet at the Burke and Wills Monument in Castlemaine at 5.30pm for the "Amazing Race" Castlemaine Challenge and Progressive meal. The evening will wind up at the Botanic Gardens Playground and finish by 8.30pm.

#### SECONDARY SCIENCE NEWS

Year 7 have been looking at the theme of Scientists, Safety and Diseases. They have completed a work requirement on Famous Scientists and their discoveries. The class also visited the Marine Discovery Centre at Queenscliff on the Round the Bay Trip earlier this term.

Year 8 have investigated the Solar System and Space. They have studied the motion of Earth around the Sun, and explored models of sunrise/sunset, phases of the moon, eclipses of the moon (lunar) and the sun (solar), the tilt of the Earth by 22.5 degrees causing the seasons of the year and the difference in hemispheres because of the seasons.

Year 9 have searched the evidence available in terms of the origin of the universe and have presented talks to the class on their findings. Topics have included the age of the Earth, Noah's Ark, DNA and complexity of cells and thermodynamics.

Year 10 began the year looking at chemistry, matter and in particular, solids, liquids and gases. Chemical equations were investigated and the Periodic Table was studied.

Individual work was completed as well and it is expected that all students complete at least two PACES on the theme studied for the term, as well as complete the work requirement specified. Some students should be able to complete 3 PACES for the term which adds to their understanding.

#### PRIMARY CROSS-COUNTRY RUN

On Friday 23 March, Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 students will have the opportunity to compete in the Castlemaine and District Primary Schools Cross Country Run at the Botanical Gardens in Castlemaine.
