Brother David worked in China bringing Bibles through communist border controls



The Church had only just started to re-emerge after decades of brutal oppression and the desperate need of believers everywhere was for Bibles.

A quarter of a century later reports are still being received of the tremendous impact those Bibles had on whole communities. Chinese Christians consider Project Pearl a key event which contributed greatly to the mighty revival presently sweeping the world's most populous nation.
