FAITH CHOICES

Joshua 24:15 reminds us to choose for ourselves whom we will serve....

Good decision-making is the key to a happy life. But good decision-making is not a skill some of us are naturally blessed with. Courage, education or the ageing process

don't automatically produce better decision-makers.

Spending time with good decision-makers is wise, but it doesn't necessarily rub off on you. And the earlier parents teach this skill to their children, the better, as in Proverbs 22:6.

So teach your children the following principles:-

The consequences you get are the result of the choices you make.

Let your children know it's not their circumstances, but decisions they make about them, that govern their lives. You may think your children know this, but they don't usually have the "cause and effect" wiring in their brains until late adolescence.

You will always have options.

Children commonly feel powerless when reacting to negative circumstances. They tend to be "either/or" thinkers, concluding that things are either all good or all bad. Teach them "both/and" thinking, because things can be bad yet you can choose to make good decisions about them.

"Either/or" thinking frequently produces children who may become pessimistic, disempowered, easily manipulated, depressed adults. Knowing they always have good options prevents circumstances from dictating their lives.
